



POST-HURRICANE,

FOOD STORAGE & PEST MANAGEMENT TIPS

- 1. When in doubt, throw it out; this includes expired foods
- 2. Throw out any food that:
 - That was likely bitten by rats, mice and other animals or contaminated with their urine or faeces
 - you know or suspect is contaminated with pesticides
 - is mouldy, especially mouldy peanuts, corn and grains
 - was contaminated by flood and muddy waters
 - you suspect or know is spoilt
 - smells "funny"
- 3. Remember First In, First Out (FIFO) and First to Expire First Out (FEFO)
- 4. Discard all perishable food that has gone unrefrigerated for more than 6 hours.
- 5. Store food in clean, dry, cool, pest free areas
- 6. Ensure that water used for cooking and washing is potable
- 7. Do not store food on the directly on the ground.
- 8. Only purchase food from reputable establishments; do not purchase food from establishments that are unhygienic or whose workers do not practice proper hygiene
- 9. Inspect food properly before purchasing; look for infestation by "weevils", expiry dates, signs of spoilage, contamination, off-odours and damage





- 10. Throw out dented, swollen or rusty canned foods; look for pin holes and any other type of damage
- 11. Wash all canned foods properly before use
- 12. Wash hands thoroughly:
 - before preparing food
 - after using the bathroom
 - after touching or coming in contact with e.g. rats and mice, contaminated food, raw meat, dirty water, dirty surfaces, pesticides and other chemicals
- 13. Only purchase pesticides from reputable establishments
- 14. Do not store foods in same area with pesticides and other chemicals
- 15. Do not store food in containers previously used to store pesticides and other chemicals
- 16. Keep the original labels pesticides and other chemicals; if the label becomes detached from containers, re-label clearly and securely
- 17. Store all pesticides and other chemicals locked away from children and other unauthorized persons
- 18. Ensure that pesticides, include rat baits, and other chemicals are always used in a safe manner to prevent interference by and poisoning of persons and pets and also to prevent contamination of food and inhabited areas; always follow the pesticide/chemical label
- 19. Use gloves if handling dead rats and mice
- 20. Do not throw dead rats and mice in the garbage or in heaps; burn or bury them as their bodies may have disease-causing fleas
- 21. Keep garbage bins covered and secure and empty garbage regularly
- 22. Remove all refuse, debris and unwanted items as soon as possible to minimize infestation by pests such as cockroaches, flies, rats and mice; food sources must be made unavailable





Ensuring Safety and Wholesomeness

- 23. Place rodent guards (i.e. metal bands) around tree trunks to prevent rats and mice from climbing
- 24. Also place bait at entry point of doors whether inside or outside.
- 25. Where possible, ensure that all wires entering homes are not routes of entry for rats.
- 26. Pet food attract rats and mice, therefore minimize spillage or excess that is accessible to rats and mice
- 27. Trim vegetation regularly and trim overhanging tree branches from buildings
- 28. To prevent rat and mice entry, completely block all unnecessary holes/openings in buildings; mesh all other openings with 1/4 inch spacing
